April 10, 2017

## **GENERAL MEETING**

President Salvatore Sansone called the meeting to order April 10<sup>th</sup> at 7:05 pm at the Pine Castle Women's Club, 5901 S. Orange Ave., Orlando, FL 32809. Other Board members present were: 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President Thelma Craig, Treasurer Dave Granger and Secretary Betty Sumner. Absent: 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President Gordon Oakley.

All stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **1<sup>ST</sup> VICE-PRESIDENT REPORT**

She stated there were eighty paid members and 65 people that have not paid their dues. She wished a Happy Birthday to: David Kayo, Rosa Santos, Dave Manor, Paul Hayes, Cameron Hickey, Jim Ingram, Gary Curtis, Mercedes DiNatale, Pamela Miller, Emmy Lin and Thomas Cook.

Our Show is April 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> and Volunteers are needed on Thursday the 27<sup>th</sup> to set up tables and on Sunday to tear down. Need Volunteers on Friday, Saturday and Sunday to help in the kitchen, silent auction, kid's corner, sluice and front door. She requested donations of pastry and for them to be wrapped in saran wrap or small bags. She will mark the price on them. Volunteers have to sign in and out every day or they will not get their shop hours. For every four hours worked, Volunteers get one-hour shop time.

## **2<sup>ND</sup> VICE-PRESIDENT REPORT**

Gordon Oakley was absent. The President reported there were 18 in attendance.

## **SECRETARY REPORT**

Nothing to report. Motion for the minutes of March 3, 2017 was requested but they had not gone out to members so this was postponed until the May meeting.

## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Jim Van Dam brought up about having three shows a year and to have one up North. He agreed to work with the Events Coordinator on this.

### **SHOW REPORT**

The President reported that the front and auxiliary rooms are full. There are six people on the waiting list. We are paying \$374 for security in accordance to the rules of the Armory. Volunteers are badly at the Show. We need out-going Volunteers that will help Paula bring visitors to the hallway and auxiliary room. He thanked Thelma for taking over the Show because of Paul Hayes. He asked that everyone give a big hand for all the work she has done. Applauding followed.

He announced that George Wood is now the Show Chairman and he will work with his wife, Deb, to make it happen. Thelma will go back to doing the kitchen. For lunch there will be hamburgers, cheeseburgers, chicken salad and hotdogs. More help is needed in the kitchen. Karen Carmona volunteered to help in the kitchen.

### **FACEBOOK**

The President reported that Deb Wood has added many pictures of our events and gemology on Facebook. We tried Facebook's advertising called boost and we've gotten over 3,200 people for a cost of \$18. The advertising includes our coupon that can be used at the Show entrance door for \$1 off admission.

### **EVENTS COORDINATOR**

Paula Wilson announced that we have speaker John McIntosh tonight. On May 8<sup>th</sup> we are having our annual auction and summer picnic. She requested that members bring their kids, families and money. This is for member appreciation

April 1<sup>st</sup> we participated in the Cattle Baron's Ball, which was a cancer fundraiser and to get our name out there. With the sluice, members wore western theme clothes. It was a lot of fun.

April 22<sup>nd</sup> is Earth Day at Lotus Park in Altamonte Springs and is a family event. We will offer kid's activities and the sluice. This is our first event with them and they estimate 3,000 people will attend. It will put the Club out there, as well as the Bead and Wire Guild.

The Bead and Wire Guild meet on May 13<sup>th</sup> and May 27<sup>th</sup>. At the first meeting of the month, we start a new project and on the 27<sup>th</sup> some members will complete their project. We start at 10am on May 13<sup>th</sup> at the Workshop.

### **WORKSHOP**

Need help to clean up the Workshop. The backroom at the Workshop needs cleaning and painting, as it is a social room. The Workshop is not all business.

The Johnson Brothers are doing our sanding wheels at \$20 each. It helps that we are a 501(c)3.

### **CONTRACT**

The President reported we needed to sign a two-year contract for the Workshop building with a 3% increase every year. If we have to break the contract, it will cost \$500. Voting was unanimous approval to sign the contract.

He added that we have 80 to 100 members. The building is for members to come in socialize, not just to cut stones. We bought a geode cracker. Question arose for the Workshop to be open in the evening as a lot of members work daily.
